### Patrol joins Guns-N-Hoses Blood Donation Campaign to fight against summer blood shortages

It is that time of year again for baseball games, fishing trips, summer vacations and fireworks. This time of year also marks the beginning of trauma season in Ohio. The time of year when motor vehicle crashes and traumatic injuries increase and often the need for blood exceeds the supply.

In addition, with all of the summer activities coming up, the amount of people that donate blood decreases. That's why the Ohio State Highway Patrol is teaming up with the American Red Cross for the 14th Annual Guns-N-Hoses blood donor campaign which runs June 25 through July 31.

Troopers, as law enforcement officers and first responders see first-hand what the gift of donating blood can do for those affected in traffic crashes and other emergency situations.

There are people alive today, people who are not suffering from debilitating injuries, and people whose quality of life is filled with hope because the decision made by people like you to donate blood. I am encouraging everyone in our community who is eligible to donate blood this trauma season and for them, in-turn to encourage their friends and family to join us in helping to save lives.

Guns-N-Hoses began in 1996 as a friendly competition between police and fire officers to see who could bring in the most blood donations. Those who donate during the campaign can make their donation a vote for either fire fighters or police officers. In the end, the patients who benefit from the available blood products are the real winners.

Counties participating in this year's campaign include: Athens, Champaign, Coshoc-ton, Crawford, Delaware, Fairfield, Fayette, Franklin, Guernsey, Hardin, Harrison, Highland, Hocking, Knox, Licking, Logan, Madison, Marion, Morgan, Morrow, Muskingum, Noble, Perry, Pickaway, Richland, Ross, Tuscarawas, Union, and Vinton. People who live in counties not located in the central Ohio region of the American Red Cross are encouraged to give blood as well this July to help save lives.

More than 16,900 pints of blood are expected to be collected during Guns-N-Hoses, and more than 1,500 pints come from fire and police officers alone. The rest are from those who support everyday heroes and want to save lives. The Red Cross and the Ohio State Highway Patrol encourage you to help make this campaign a success, and to help save lives this summer.

Community participants who donate blood and cast their ballot for either fire fighters or police officers will be eligible for incentives that include: an "I Voted" sticker, a \$7 off entry coupon to Cedar Point, a Guns-N-Hoses can cozies (provided to presenting donors who come to donate with a redeemable "recruitment card" which are given out by fire fighters and police officers,) a chance to win a drawing for a \$100 gas card, and a free lease on any Saturn vehicle of their choice.

Troopers make a difference in our community every day by keeping highways safe. This trauma season I encourage all of you, to join us in giving blood and helping to ensure a stable blood supply this trauma season.
