


### SIGNIFICANT HIGHWAY PATROL APPREHENSIONS

10/13/2008 – 10/26/2008

Sergeant Ralston	The Marietta Post received a call of an apparent OVI driver on SR7 in Washington Co. Sgt. Ralston located the vehicle and performed a traffic stop. Upon approach, a strong odor of alcohol came from the vehicle and it appeared that the driver had urinated in his pants. The suspect had glassy eyes, slurred speech, and refused OVI tests. An administrative inventory of the vehicle uncovered an AR 50 sniper rifle, two bolt action rifles, a revolver, and a large amount of ammunition. Further investigation found the AR 50 to be stolen out of Gallia Co.

Trooper Myers	During an Operation TRIAD on I71 in Morrow Co., Trooper Myers clocked a 2001 Chevy Silverado traveling 83mph in a 65mph zone. Trooper Laughlin located the vehicle and upon approach, a strong odor of marijuana and alcohol was coming from the vehicle. The suspect driver failed several field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. An administrative inventory of the vehicle found a cooler on the front seat with 20-12oz cans of beer and an open fifth bottle of vodka in the center console. Officers uncovered several bags of marijuana, 9 different prescription meds, a metal pipe, a grinder, a roller, and a plastic snort tube.



An OVI offense is considered a felony if the person has 1 prior felony OVI, 3 prior OVI convictions within 6 years or 5 prior OVI convictions in 20 years.

### OSHP FELONY OVI CASES

- OSHP Troopers have initiated 233 felony OVI cases so far this year (Jan-Sept 2008). This is 32 fewer felony OVI cases than in Jan-Sept 2007 and 66 fewer than in Jan-Sept 2006 (-12% and -22% respectively).
- OSHP District 9 Troopers have been involved in 39 felony OVI cases in Jan-Sept 2008.
- At the County-level, the largest number of felony OVI cases occurred in Lorain (17), followed by Belmont (12), Ashtabula (8), Clark (8), Portage (8), and Stark (8). Overall, over one in four OSHP felony OVI cases were issued in one of these six counties in Jan-Sept 2008 (61 or 26%).
- OSHP Troopers were involved in 37 felony OVI cases in May, the most of any month during Jan-Sept 2008.
- Most OVI felony arrests occurred on a Saturday or Sunday (102 or 44%) between midnight and 2:00am (96 or 41%).
