

2011 Statistics

- From January through April 2011, the Ohio State Highway Patrol has made 1,979 drug arrests. This is 109 more drug arrests (+6%) than during the same time period in 2010.
- Franklin County led the state with 126 drug arrests. Scioto (80), Montgomery (72) and Lorain (65) Counties also had more than 60 drug arrests.
- At the Post level, Post 65 Circleville led the state with 85 drug arrests followed by Post 73 Portsmouth (74) and Post 76 Canton (74). Compared to last year, Post 80 Marysville had the largest increase in drug arrests (+34) in 2011

Drug Seizures

- From January through April 2011, OSHP troopers seized more than 4,063 pounds of marijuana. This is a 306% increase over the January through April 2010 total (1,002 pounds).
- Pill seizures have also increased significantly in 2011. From January through April, OSHP troopers seized 20,259 pills during traffic stops. Last year, during the same period, 12,130 pills were seized. This is an increase of 67% over last year.
- Troopers seized 6,291 grams of heroin from January through April 2011. While still high, heroin seizures were 58% higher (9,914 grams seized) during January through April 2010.

*Ohio Turnpike. On the adjacent map, Turnpike arrests are included in the counties in which they occurred.
