





Failure to Yield Crashes & Citations

Failure to Yield Crashes*

- In 2012, there were 37,475 crashes across Ohio caused by failure to yield (FTY).** This includes 181 fatal crashes resulting in 187 deaths. Another 23,353 people were injured in 13,750 injury crashes.
- Drivers aged 16-25 were at-fault in 30% of FTY crashes. This is nearly twice as high as those in the 26-35 age group (16%). Older age groups caused even fewer crashes.
- FTY crashes occurred most frequently in Franklin County (5,430). Other counties with high numbers of FTY crashes include: Cuyahoga (3,335), Hamilton (3,188), Summit (2,021) and Montgomery (1,723).

Failure to Yield Citations*

- In 2012, OSHP officers wrote 22,025 citations for Failure to Yield. This is 3% more FTY citations than were issued by Troopers in 2011. Male drivers were the recipients of 61% of FTY citations.
- Twenty-four percent of FTY citations (5,206) were written as a result of a motor vehicle crash. Fifty-five percent of the drivers cited in these crashes were men.
- Nearly half (47%) of FTY violations occurring in 2012 happened during the afternoon hours between noon and 6:00 p.m.
