

Failure to Yield Crashes¹

- In 2015, there were 49,473 crashes on Ohio roadways involving a vehicle failing to yield (FTY) to another vehicle.² Included in this total are 190 fatal crashes that killed 206 individuals. Another 28,857 people were injured in FTY crashes. Eighteen percent (18%) of all fatal crashes in 2015 were caused by a driver failing to yield. FTY crashes rose 9% and fatal FTY crashes jumped 28% from 2014 to 2015.
- FTY crashes tend to be more severe than crashes with other causes. Thirty-six percent (36%) of FTY crashes resulted in deaths or injuries in 2015 compared to 25% of all crashes.
- Drivers of all ages cause FTY crashes. While drivers aged 16-25 caused 30% of FTY crashes in 2015, older drivers aged 65 and over were the cause of another 16%. Just over half (52%) of FTY crashes were caused by men.

Failure to Yield Citations

- In 2015, OSHP troopers wrote 23,623 citations that included a Failure to Yield charge. This number has remained relatively steady, varying by only ± 1% over the last three years
- Twenty-four percent (24%) of FTY citations were issued as a result of a motor vehicle crash. Male drivers received 61% of FTY citations.
