




## FELONY STOPS

### Felony Stops

- From January to July 2011, OSHP troopers made a total of 2,079 felony stops. This consisted of 1,546 (74%) stops with a felony arrest and 564 (27%) stops that included a felony warrant apprehension.\*\*
- Franklin county led the state with 171 felony stops. Other counties with large numbers of felony stops include Scioto (109), Lorain (70), Lucas (65) and Jackson (65).
- Together, these 5 counties accounted for almost one in four felony stops (480 or 23%) made from January to July 2011.
- More than one in three felony stops occurred on a Friday or a Saturday (740/36%). For all days of the week, midnight to 2:59 a.m. was the busiest period for felony stops (457/22%).
- From January to July 2011, 4 troopers made more than 30 felony stops, Trooper Lewis (P73), Trooper Seabolt (P71), Trooper Schack (P65) and Trooper Wilson (P45).

### Felony Arrests

- Forty-seven percent (47%) of those arrested by troopers were charged with a drug offense.
- Other charges made against persons arrested by troopers included operating a vehicle intoxicated (OVI, 22%), theft and fraud (17%), weapons violations (8%), resisting arrest (4%) and assault (3%).

\*Felony stops made on the turnpike are counted in the county in which they were made. \*\*31 stops had both a felony arrest and a felony warrant apprehension.
