

Felony Stops

- In 2011, OSHP troopers made a total of 3,573 felony stops. This consisted of 2,675 (74%) stops with a felony arrest and 949 (26%) stops that included a felony warrant apprehension.*
- Franklin county led the state with 286 felony stops in 2011. The rest of the top five counties for felony stops include Scioto (180), Lorain (133), Lucas (124) and Cuyahoga (104).
- Together, these 5 counties accounted for almost one in four felony stops (827 or 23%) made in 2011.
- More than one in three felony stops occurred on a Friday or a Saturday (1,266/35%). For all days of the week, midnight to 2:59 a.m. was the busiest period for felony stops (772/22%).
- In 2011, 3 troopers made more than 50 felony stops: Trooper Lewis (P73), Trooper Wilson (P45) and Trooper Schack (P65).

Felony Arrests

- Forty-seven percent (47%) of those arrested by troopers were charged with a drug offense.
- Other charges made against persons arrested by troopers included operating a vehicle intoxicated (OVI, 23%), theft and fraud (17%), weapons violations (9%), resisting arrest (4%) and assault (4%).

*51 stops had both a felony arrest and a felony warrant apprehension.
