





SIGNIFICANT HIGHWAY PATROL APPREHENSION LOOKING BEYOND THE LICENSE PLATE

Trooper Barrett stopped a 2004 Ford F-150 with PA plates for a following too close violation on I70 in Preble Co. Numerous criminal indicators and a PC search by Trooper Smart and K9 Rita uncovered 3 garbage bags with 6 compressed blocks of marijuana located in the bed of the truck. A total of 150 lbs of marijuana valued at \$340,000 was confiscated.

Trooper Barrett stopped a 1995 Toyota Tacoma with AZ plates for a marked lane violation. Numerous criminal indicators and a PC search by Trooper Simms and K9 Lady uncovered 50 lbs of marijuana valued at over \$113,000 in a duffel bag in the back seat of the vehicle.

SIGNIFICANT HIGHWAY PATROL APPREHENSION ASSISTANCE TO OTHER AGENCIES

Jackson CSO requested the assistance of an OSHP canine unit for the execution of a private property search warrant and additional units to handle traffic near the residence. Trooper Mikesh and K9 Marco assisted with the search and along with Jackson CSO deputies several large bags of suspected marijuana, 2 rifles, 1 handgun, 2 digital scales, and other miscellaneous drug paraphernalia were discovered throughout the house. The Jackson Co Health Department was contacted and is condemning the residence.



CRASHES INVOLVING AT-FAULT JUVENILE DRIVERS

During the three-year period juvenile drivers were at fault in 61,784 traffic crashes, resulting in 27,838 injuries and 212 deaths on Ohio roadways.

Speeding was the most frequent contributing circumstance, accounting for more than half (58%) of crashes caused by juvenile drivers. Impaired driving by juveniles contributed to 784 traffic crashes over the three-year period.

JUVENILE TRAFFIC-RELATED ARRESTS/CITATIONS by OSHP

During the three-year period OSHP troopers administered citations to a total of 34,921 juvenile drivers. Of these, 18,615 (53%) involved speeding; 7,251 (21%) involved safety belt violations; 1,350 involved driving without a valid driver license; and 505 involved driving while alcohol- or drug-impaired.

Juvenile traffic citations ranged by county. Clermont County (1,199) had the most from 2006 to 2008, followed by Stark (1,144), Portage (887), Fairfield (879), and Scioto (874).

Nearly one-third (10,813/31%) of juvenile citations took place on Monday through Friday between the hours of 2:00 and 8:00 p.m. Another one-third (11,958/34%) took place on Saturday or Sunday.

JANUARY - JULY 2009*

There have been 8,018 crashes caused by juvenile drivers thus far in 2009, resulting in 16 deaths and 2,315 injuries.

From January 1 through July 31, 2009, OSHP officers administered 5,133 traffic citations to juvenile drivers.

Nearly one in three (1,582/31%) of the citations included aggressive driving violations; 931 (18%) juvenile traffic offenders were cited for driving 20 mph or more above the posted speed limit.
