## New Auxiliary Recruit Class in Training

In Mid October at the request of Major Born, Colonel McClellan approved a new Auxiliary Recruit class.

The Auxiliary numbers have declined in recent years to less than 140 Officers. The new recruit class which started January 7, 2006, has 22 Officers and will bring the Auxiliary strength to 158 officers.

The training is held at the Patrol Academy in Columbus and lasts 7 Saturdays. Patrol Academy Instructors and patrol field units provided the training. The training consisted of an overview of the Patrols daily functions, Auxiliary Officers roles, firearms, mace and Taser familiarization, subject control and survival techniques, law enforcement communication, homeland security and patrol policies.

## William T Bucher selected for Earl Ulmer Meritorious Service Award

The Ulmer award is the highest honor bestowed upon an Auxiliary Officer and is awarded for outstanding service, courage, valor or heroism. Auxiliary Officer Bucher was riding on patrol with Trooper Darius Roberts when they responded to a pursuit. When the pursuit ended, the suspect exited his car waving a large screwdriver at the responding officers. Ultimately, troopers fired on the suspect and Trooper Tiffany Appollonio was struck by a



bullet. Auxiliary Bucher immediately went to the radio and advised that an officer had been shot and requested medical assistance. He then went to Trooper Appollonio, helped her to the ground and performed first aid until the medics arrived. Auxiliary Bucher is assigned to the Delaware Post.

## Lt. Thomas R. St. Clair selected 2005 State Auxiliary of the Year

Lt. St. Clair donated 963 hours to the citizens of Ohio during 2005. Of those hours 757 hours were worked across all shifts of patrol. 233 of his hours were donated on Holiday Weekends.

Along with his patrol time he worked on special projects related to criminal patrol tactical squads, complaints investigations, and background investigations. Lt. St. Clair is assigned to the Warren Post.



## Auxiliary Officer Robert M. Yodice selected as 2005 William J. Duffy Award of Excellence Winner



The Duffy Award recognizes the Auxiliary Officer who donates a minimum of 300 hours each year from the previous 3 years, maintains physical fitness, and responds to emergency call outs and special details when needed. Only 17 Auxiliary Officer met the criteria to be eligible for the Duffy Award in 2005. Auxiliary Officer Yodice averaged 1619 hours per year for the last 3 years. Bob has

donated time riding with Troopers on all shifts and in all Districts over the years. Additionally he has worked special details statewide. He was selected the State Officer of the year in 2002 and 2004. Auxiliary Yodice is assigned to the Chardon Post.

## Auxiliary Hours per Unit Increase in 2005, Total Hours Down

Auxiliary officers volunteered a total of 28,126 hours in 2005, a decrease of 4,805 hours from 2004. The primary reason for the overall decrease is there are less Auxiliary Officers now than there were in 2004. Average hours per Auxiliary officer increased from 186 in 2004 to 207 in 2005.

The top three districts, by total Auxiliary hours, were Columbus with 8,406 hours, Warren with 3,812 hours and Massillon with 3,438 hours.

## Auxiliary Statewide Training Day

The annual Auxiliary training was held at the Academy on October 8th and October 22nd with 4 to 5 districts of the Auxiliary attending each day.

After an opening session by Major Born, there were Uniform Inspections and ID photos taken. The Auxiliary Officers then attended a presentation on the Auxiliary Officer's role in the recent Trooper involved shooting on IS-71 by Officer Bill Bucher.

## New Auxiliary Body Armor Ordered

Throughout 2005 the Auxiliary secured funding for replacement of 20% of their existing body armor. The majority of Auxiliary Officers are currently using body armor handed down when trooper's body armor is replaced. Most body armor in use by the Auxiliary is at least 10 years old.

The Auxiliary received numerous donations from American Legion Post's throughout the state. Additional money was raised during a raffle held during Auxiliary Statewide Training. The new body armor is threat level II extended protection constructed of aramid fabrics.

The Auxiliary eligible to receive new body armor was determined based on total hours donated in 2004. Enough funding was secured to purchase 27 vests. Ten Auxiliary officers decided to keep their current body armor to allow someone with older armor to get a replacement. The Auxiliary Officers who have ordered a new vest are listed below:

Then there was a classroom presentation on response to resistance and stops and approaches. In the afternoon the Auxiliary officers were divided into three groups. One group was training on Taser familiarization and mace. During the



training every Auxiliary Officer was maced. Another group received stops and approaches training involving an officer shot situation and shotgun simulations firing, the remaining were trained on handcuffing and subject control techniques. Each of the groups switched and received the other sessions.

A big thank-you goes to all the instructors (S/Lt. Shawn Lee, Lt. Dan

Greene, Sgt. Boscy, Sgt. Rine, Sgt. Crispin, Sgt. Raines, Tpr. Homrighausen and Tpr Bierdeman) who helped make this one of the best training sessions ever. A special thank you is extended Sgt. Elschlager, Sgt Quinn and Tpr DelCol who assisted on their own time.

The Auxiliary also sold raffle tickets at each session and numerous items were passed out after the second session. The money collected from the raffle this year will be added to the Auxiliary fund and be used to purchase body armor and general operating cost for Auxiliary operations.
