Phase Two of “Operation Safety Net” starts tomorrow

COLUMBUS – The Ohio State Highway Patrol will once again join the New York State Police, Pennsylvania State Police, West Virginia State Police and U.S Border Patrol in the second phase of a concentrated traffic and criminal patrol operation starting tomorrow and continuing on and off throughout the summer in an effort to reduce fatal and injury crashes, while interdicting the criminal element.

The effort, “Operation Safety Net” is focused on the eastern part of the state and is targeting impaired and aggressive driving, as well as speed and other high-risk behaviors, crash causing violations and commercial vehicle enforcement. Surrounding states and Border Patrol will focus on connecting interstates during this effort.

This effort is the second of four that will take place this summer.
