

Crashes Involving At-Fault Teen* Drivers

- From 2009-2011, teen drivers were at fault in 114,737 traffic crashes, resulting in 50,492 injuries and 329 deaths on Ohio roadways. Teen drivers were at fault in 10% of all fatal crashes during 2009-2011.
- Speed-related circumstances accounted for more than half (56%) of crashes caused by teen drivers. Impaired driving by teens contributed to 2,606 traffic crashes from 2009-2011.
- Half (50%) of all crashes caused by teen drivers occurred between the hours of 2:00PM and 8:00PM. The majority (91%) of teen drivers who caused crashes were wearing a safety belt.

Teen Traffic Citations by OSHP

- During the three-year period, OSHP Troopers wrote 123,894 citations to teen drivers. Of these, 75,104 (61%) were speed-related; 23,829 (19%) involved safety belt violations; and 3,379 (3%) involved driving while alcohol- and/or drug-impaired.
- Franklin county (4,272) had the most teen traffic citations during 2009-2011 followed by Clermont (3,292), Portage (3,228), Mahoning (3,145), and Lorain (3,031).
- Nearly one-fourth (24%) of citations to teen drivers occurred between the hours of 2:00PM and 7:00PM on weekdays. Over one-third (35%) happened on Saturday or Sunday.
