The Columbus Marauders to honor memory of Tpr. Andrew Baldrige at charity football game

A charity football game will be played in honor of the memory of Trooper Andrew Baldrige who was killed while on-duty in a single-vehicle crash on February 4, 2010. Tpr. Baldrige's brother, an officer with Marion Police Department, will be an honorary team captain at the coin toss. A plaque and a Marauders jersey bearing Tpr. Baldrige's name and unit number will be presented to the Baldrige family at half-time by Colonel David W. Dicken, Patrol superintendent. Tickets to the event are \$5.00 per person.

The Patrol's Honor Guard will present the colors, and the Patrol's Sgt. Michael Maughmer will sing the National Anthem before the charity game.

The Columbus Marauders are part of a 501(c)(3) charity organization, formed to raise money for the families of police officers and firefighters killed or seriously injured in the line of duty, as well as children who have been the victims of domestic abuse. The Marauders are one of 25 teams that comprise the National Public Safety Football League. Team members are all public safety employees, such as; police officers, firefighters, paramedics and corrections officers.
